

INCLUSION AND RETURN

InitiAID



InitiAID is a day care service for the accommodation structures of organisations in the asylum and refugee sector. Root & Branch develops low-threshold services for people with special needs in these accommodation structures.

InitiAID follows the dual-intent approach. This means that the services are designed both for long-term integration in Switzerland and for return to the country of origin or a safe third country.

1. General conditions

- InitiAID offers refugees supervised day structure services within the framework of a Root & Branch specialist group during their time in a Federal Asylum Centre (BAZ) or collective accommodation.
- This offer primarily serves the purpose of social integration. It offers a supportive environment in the participant's cultural and language context.
- Root & Branch takes a leading role and ensures smooth operations. Root & Branch takes care of the planning, organisation, coaching and potential transport of participants between the day structure service and the accommodation.
- Root & Branch takes care of all administrative procedures and formalities.
- Participation is designed to promote or maintain personal resources. Participation is possible at any time. The duration of participation depends on personal needs and requirements.
- The individual follow-up solutions to InitiAID are - if realistic - planned in advance and in consultation with the participants and the referring agencies and are communicated and implemented in the form of a weekly plan.
- During their participation in the program, the participants are closely supported and coached by Root & Branch. The individual coaching is based on the needs of the participants and aims to find a satisfactory follow-up solution for them.
- Root & Branch places great importance on a continuous exchange with the referring agencies in order to support the participants in their learning and inclusion process in the best possible way.

2. Target group

Places will primarily be awarded to persons who

a.) have special needs that make it difficult for them to access language support and integration services or for persons who, for an unspecified reason, cannot be assigned to existing offers by other providers.

Prerequisites:

Motivation to build up or maintain a personal daily structure.
